She says, "studies show students are more suited to perform at their full capacity if their non-educational needs are met first... whether that means providing a peanut butter and jelly sandwich... or cheering them on in their other interests, I always put the students first while holding high expectations for rigor and academic discovery." The Holmen AgriScience Department offers 13 courses in Plant Science, Animal Science, Natural Resources, Leadership, and Power Structure and Technical systems. Six of the thirteen courses are offered for Science Elective, and three are transcripted through Western Technical College.

Other notable achievements Joelle has implemented include an Advisory Board that has representatives for all of the AFNR Pathways, multiple school-based enterprise projects for students to work in, and an active media and social media presence.

The focus of the association is to provide professional development, legislative support and educational resources for teachers to enhance their local agriculture education programs.
