Off - Site Service Locations:

Site 1: City of Madison Parks - Turville Point

- Description of Service Work: In addition to traditional recreational facilities and open space, Madison Parks maintains natural areas and sustainable landscapes that support pollinator habitat and provide resilience to climate change. Participants will have a choice of removing buckthorn, loading wood from downed trees, or removing burdock.

Site 2: City of Madison Parks - Olin Park Lakeside

- Description of Service Work: In addition to traditional recreational facilities and open space, Madison Parks maintains natural areas and sustainable landscapes that support pollinator habitat and provide resilience to climate change. Participants will be planting native shrubs and plants.

Site 3: City of Madison Parks - Warner Park

Volunteers will be helping with trash removal, brush clearing, and invasive species removal

Site 4: Schumacher Farm Park

- Description of Service Work: Schumacher Farm Park (a Dane County Park) is a historic 40-acre farmstead. The property features the historic farmhouse and outbuildings, trails through 27-acres of restored prairie. The park hosts workshops and public events, and has both modern and rustic spaces available for private rentals. Volunteers will be removing invasive plants from the park.

Site 5: UW-Madison Arboretum

- Description of Service Work: The group will be helping with upkeep of the Longenecker Horticultural Gardens. Located on 35 acres north of the Visitor Center, this living museum features approximately 4,000 specimens composed of over 2,600 kinds of trees, shrubs, and vines organized by plant group and laid out in a park like setting. It is Wisconsin's largest and most comprehensive collection of woody plants. Work activities may include weeding, mulching specimens and/or invasive species removal.

Site 6: Lussier Community Education Center

We do so through our youth programming, food resources, and connecting our community members with a wide array of resources. Volunteers will be completing a variety of outdoor tasks: working in garden spaces, rearranging shed space, cleaning up the playground. Some inside organizational tasks such as inventorying and organizing upstairs space.

Site 8: Goodman Community Center

older years. We have a preschool, elementary/middle and high school afterschool and summer camps, a dynamic older adult program as well as a busy food pantry. The students would be helping us get our preschool and elementary classrooms ready for our summer camp. We'll be organizing, cleaning and generally sprucing up. We might also work in our playground and gardens if the weather is good.
