## Important Message for All Members and Advisors Attending Convention PLEASE READ

### Proper Etiquette, Official Dress and Courtesy of Attendees at State FFA Convention

State FFA Convention is a wonderful experience for everyone to celebrate the accomplishments of the past year, recognize many individuals and chapters for their achievements and thank supporters of the FFA Organization. Convention reenergizes all of us while having a lot of fun, serving others, meeting new people and having great experiences.

Unfortunately, we have had some issues with general proper etiquette and courtesy from some of our members and advisors in attendance. For the 2026 Convention, we are asking attendees to be more conscious of their behavior, their interactions with food service personnel, their official dress and remember the important Code of Conduct FFA members follow in our organization. Although we think that students already know this, advisors need to help us help students understand what is appropriate and what is not in all of these areas. *Thank you advisors for making a positive impact on your students because you may be one of the few people in your students' lives that teach these important life skills. You are the role models for students to follow. Please lead by example and not only help your students but others that may need to be reminded of proper etiquette. Remember a "thank you" goes a long way in making a great impression but more importantly making others feel appreciated for their service.*

Many of you may have experienced long food lines with staff trying to keep up with serving everyone, messy tables when finding a place to sit, etc. People cannot help themselves to way too much food per plate/person in the buffet lines. Those that are eating at our meal functions need to remember when going through buffet lines, *the meal counts are based on portions.* If it says that you can only have one or two bread sticks, or one cookie, that is what we need people to follow. Piling heaping servings of food on plates, is not what is planned for. Please help your students understand, *these buffets are not "all you can eat" buffets.*

*In addition, remember to review with members how **Proper Official Dress** is worn. We have seen a decrease in the pride of wearing official dress at a number of our events.* Remind students to zip up jackets, tie ties properly (It was my ag teacher that taught me how to tie a tie...even though I wore a scarf) and look good and professional in their dress. Review skirt length with the females as there are some that are way too short. It would be better to wear slacks than a skirt that is too short. This is also an important life skill that we can all teach our students. **Remember proper official dress is required for members attending State FFA Convention.** A long-standing tradition in Wisconsin is to uphold the official dress code and look sharp and professional. **Help us keep that tradition alive!!**

We appreciate your attention to this important part of our State Convention Experience. It's all about helping students to grow, learn how to interact with others and put their best foot forward. Thank you and I am excited to once again celebrate with you and your students in Madison June 15-18!!

# We are just days away from the opening of the 97th Wisconsin FFA Convention!!

**Make sure all your members complete the Online Waiver if they haven't done so yet this school year. Online Waivers are on the same site as registering for events and checking your accounts. **This must be completed.** This is our Code of Conduct as well as our Photo Release. Complete before arriving at Convention.**

Online registration is open until 11:59 p.m. on Thursday June 11. If you miss this, you can still register onsite. However registration fees will increase to \$30 for members and \$30 for advisors. Guest registration will remain at \$15.00.

If a member/advisor is just coming for the day or any portion of the convention, you will need to register those individuals and the cost is \$25 online/\$30 onsite.

Those guests that have been signed up for a State Degree Lunch Ticket, will not need to be added to your guest registration. Their meal ticket is their registration. That is the only meal function other than the School Officials where the registration is included.

If you missed getting the Concert tickets for Tuesday night, they will be available for sale on site.

Meal tickets both sponsored and purchased MUST be purchased/requested ahead of convention. No "extra" tickets will be available onsite, so if you missed something as far as meal tickets, contact me right away and we can add your tickets to our count.

# Wisconsin FFA Convention Onsite Registration and Ticket Pick Up/Payment

Registration and the Ticket Pick Up/Payment is at the same registration table. We ask that you first confirm and update your registration with Darren Swartz and Jackie Johnson and then move down the table to pick up your tickets from our DPI Office Operations Assistant.

If you need to still pay for your tickets and/or registration, you can bring a check, cash or pay by credit card. We ask that all tickets and registration be paid for at the time of pick up.

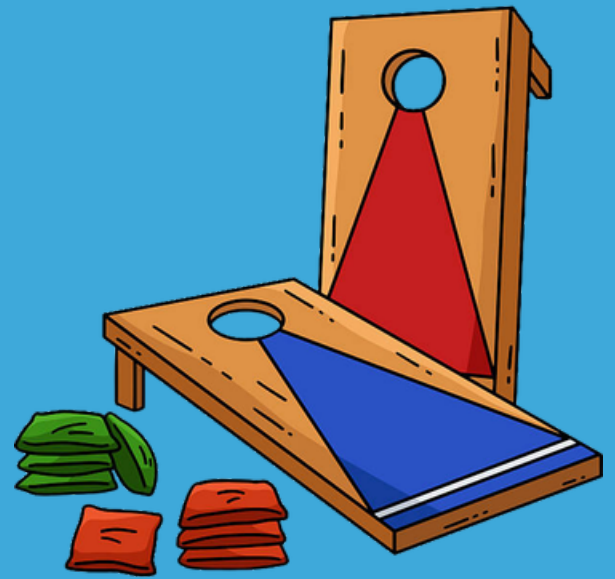

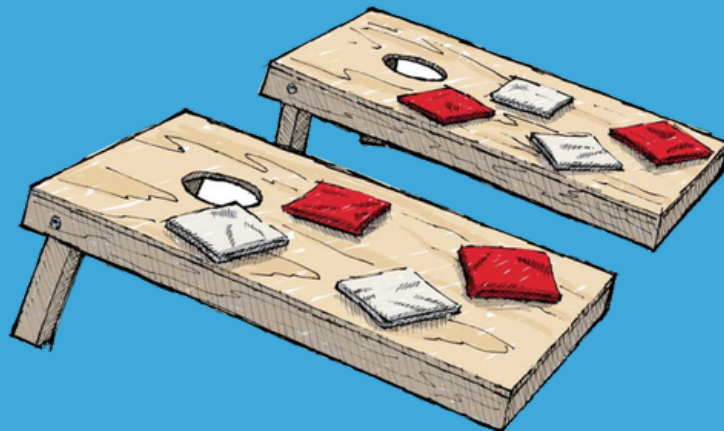

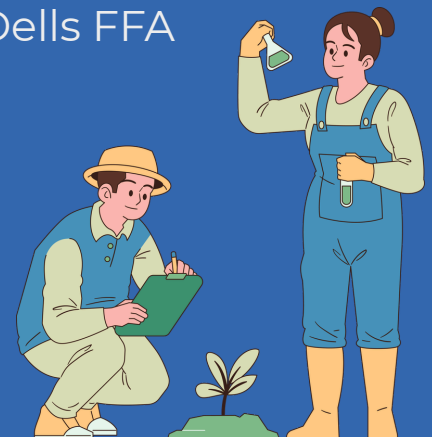
